#### Attention All GTGC members:

It's time to RENEW your 2022-2023 club membership. Follow the steps below to guide you through the process. ## **Step A**

1. Enter the Green Thumb Garden Club website into your browser: www.greenthumbgardenclubinc.org

2. In the upper right hand green bar, choose MEMBER LOGIN

3. You will be prompted to enter your email.

For the initial password (DO NOT check Request a Password), type in **gtgc1234** (the letters are all lower case)

You will be prompted to choose your unique password. PLEASE write it down.

4. Once you choose your unique password, you will be taken to your membership information which you can update at any time and you can now access **all on-line, member-only information as well as renew your GTGC membership via the website.** 

## **STEP B**

I. Go to <u>www.greenthumbgardenclubinc.org</u>.

Note: In order to renew your membership on-line, you must have already logged in and chose your unique password.

2. Click on **Join Us** 

3. You will be taken to *Renew Membership* and prompted to enter your email and your password.

4. At the bottom of the renewal page: IF YOU CHANGE YOUR MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION, YOU MUST CLICK ON SAVE & CONTINUE. IF NO CHANGES, CLICK *Renew, Upgrade or Update Billing.* 

5. On the next screen, click on your membership choice (individual or family) and enter your credit card information. If you wish to make an additional donation, please choose the amount.

AGENDA FOR THE JUNIOR GARDENER CLUB MEETING FOR MARCH 11TH

- 1. ROLL CALL BY THE ELEMENTARY TEACHER,
- 2. PASS OUT EACH CHILD'S FOLDER, AND GLOVES,
- FIRST FIFTEEN MINUTES-DISCUSSION OF VEGETABLE PLANTING
  - I. INQUIRE ABOUT HOW THEIR TERRARIUMS ARE DOING AND IF THEY HAVE ANY QUESTIONS.
  - 2. PASS OUT INFORMATION ON VEGETABLE PLANTING AND TALK ABOUT WHEN TO PLANT.

3. DIVIDE THE GROUP INTO TWO GROUPS; ONE FOR VEGETABLES AND ONE FOR HERBS. SECOND FIFTEEN MINUTES-PLANTING OF VEGETABLES AND HERBS

- 1. REMOVE COVERS OFF THE TWO BEDS THAT WILL BE USED TO PLANT VEGETABLES AND HERBS.
- 2. PERFORM SOME MAINTENANCE TO REMOVE WEEDS THAT HAVE GROWN SINCE THE FEBRUARY MEETING.
- 3. PLANT THE VEGETABLES AND HERBS.
- 4. PASS OUT PLANT MARKERS TO IDENTIFY THEIR VEGETABLE/HERB
- LAST HALF AN HOUR -MATCHING VEGETABLE PICTURES TO PLANTING INFORMATION
  - I. EXPLAIN THAT THEY ARE GOING TO TRY AND MATCH PICTURES OF VEGETABLES TO THEIR PLANTING INSTRUCTIONS.
  - 2. ONCE MATCHED THEY WILL GLUE THE PLANTING INSTRUCTIONS TO THE BACK OF THE VEGETABLE PICTURE
  - 3. EXPLAIN THAT THIS WILL HELP THEM AS A REFERENCE WHEN THEY PLANT VEGETABLES IN THEIR OWN YARD.
  - 4. PUT ALL THEIR EFFORTS INTO THEIR FOLDERS AND COLLECT THE GLOVES AND FOLDERS FOR THE NEXT MEETING.
